

IS THE MASTER OF TEACHING (PRIMARY) DEGREE RIGHT FOR YOU?

As you consider a career transition into primary teaching, it's likely you:

- I Enjoy being around children;
- Are flexible and skilled at time management;
- Have the desire and ability to help others;
- Relate well with people, especially children;
- Can make ideas simple and easy to understand; and,
- | Enjoy discovering new things and sharing those discoveries with others.

If this describes you, a transition from your current career into the primary classroom is bound to be successful.

WHAT WILL I BE STUDYING?

The degree consists of 16 units of study over four semesters full-time, or the equivalent part-time. You will complete:

- Eight education units (core, curriculum and pedagogical studies units), and
- Eight discipline-specific units.

The **core units** will prepare you to successfully teach young people in a range of educational topics, such as: classroom management, teaching students with special education needs, and indigenous education.

The **curriculum and pedagogical studies** units will help you to apply quality-teaching principles to specific teaching areas, such as: literacy education, classroom safety, curriculum development and teaching strategies.

The **discipline-specific units** will prepare you to teach within Key Learning Areas. For example, the unit Curriculum Studies - Teaching English 1 focuses on teaching English from Kindy to Year 2 with an emphasis on handwriting, writing and structuring literacy blocks.

Am I eligible?

The Master of Teaching (Primary) degree offers the unique opportunity for you to give your bachelor's degree new life.

Our Master of Teaching (Primary) degree has helped students from diverse backgrounds, such as public safety, law, psychology, nursing, communication, science, journalism and more, successfully become primary teachers.

To be eligible to study the Master of Teaching (Primary), you must have studied at least eight semester-long units in a Key Learning Area or a combination of Key Learning Areas from the primary school curriculum during your undergraduate degree.

Key Learning Areas include:

| English | Mathematics

| Science and Technology | Human Society and its Environment

| Creative Arts | Personal Development, Health and Physical Education.

IMPORTANT PROGRAM DETAILS

Fees

Most Australian and New Zealand Master of Teaching (Primary) students receive a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) to study this degree at Avondale. A CSP means that the Australian government partially subsidises course fees and you pay a small student contribution. In 2022, the student contribution is \$498 per unit of study. This is a substantial saving on the full tuition fees. Eligible domestic students can also apply to defer their fee contribution to a FEE-HELP loan. See www.studyassist.gov.au for more information.

Tuition fees for international students are A\$3,257 per unit of study.

*This is the fee for a standard unit of study. Some units attract higher fees.

Program Intakes

There are two intakes a year: February/March and July/August.

Program Duration

The Master of Teaching (Primary) course consists of 16 units of study. You can choose to study full-time over four semesters for two years, or part-time equivalent.

Entry Requirements

Prospective Australian or New Zealand students will need to:

- Have a suitable Australian bachelor's degree or equivalent degree that meets the requirements of the New South Wales Education Standards Authority (NESA).
- Submit an online personal statement addressing four simple questions. Click here to see the questions.
