The Master of Nursing is offered as a part-time, distance-education degree. Students interact with academics and other students through forums, optional face-to-face lectures, online lectures, video recordings, and Zoom drop-in sessions. You can receive as much or as little support as you need.

Avondale's Master of Nursing is unique because of its focus on holistic wellbeing, through our Centre of Lifestyle Medicine, and leadership skills, in partnership with our Business School.

WHAT WILL I BE STUDYING?

Our Master of Nursing by coursework has optional exit points at **Graduate Certificate** and **Graduate Diploma in Nursing**. You can choose to specialise in Clinical Nursing, Clinical Teaching or Leadership and Management.

Major areas of study include:

- | Leadership and management approaches

The degree will extend and deepen a registered nurse's knowledge, skills and appreciation of advanced practice that considers professional, legal, and ethical requirements.

IMPORTANT PROGRAM DETAILS

Fees

Tuition fees for 2023 are A\$2,495* per unit of study for domestic students, and A\$3,405 per unit of study for international students. Eligible domestic students can apply to defer their tuition fees to a FEE-HELP loan.

*This is the fee for a standard unit of study. Some units attract higher fees.

Program Intakes

There are two intakes a year: February/March and July/August.

Program Duration

The Master of Nursing includes 11 units of study over 1.5 years full-time or part-time equivalent. The maximum duration allowed for the completion of this course is five years from commencement.

Entry Requirements

Prospective Australian or New Zealand students will need to:

- | Have completed a Bachelor of Nursing; or
- | Have completed a Graduate Certificate or Diploma in Nursing; or
- Are currently practicing as a registered nurse (with AHPRA); and have a minimum of 12 months of experience within the last five years working as a registered nurse; and
- Be employed as a registered nurse in clinical settings for Clinical Teaching and Clinical Nursing specialities.

NB: Equivalent qualifications include a Bachelor of Health Science in Nursing or an overseas qualification equivalent to a Bachelor of Nursing qualification in Australia by the Department of Education and Training Country education profile.
